ONE: The name of this corporation is San Diego Geological Society, Inc.

TWO: This corporation is a nonprofit public benefit corporation and is not organized for the private gain of any person. It is organized under the Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law for charitable purposes. - **1a.** The Society plans to provide Education grants in the form of scholarships supporting academic excellence in geology and related earth sciences from elementary through graduate levels.
- **1b.** The purpose of the scholarships is to promote academic excellence and research in geology and related earth sciences. The amount of the scholarships will range from approximately \$50 for elementary level, up to \$2000 at the graduate level. We initially plan for individual annual undergraduate and graduate scholarship amounts to be \$500 to \$750 each.
  - 1c. We do not plan to award educational loans.

- 1d. Our scholarship program will be publicized by contacting geological science departments at regional accredited institutions of higher learning, science fair organizers, an item on our website, and mailings to our participants and supporters.
- **1e.** The Society is new and has not yet prepared any solicitation or announcements for our educational grants program.
  - 1f. The Society is new and has not prepared an application.
- 3. Criteria we will use to determine who is eligible for our educational grants will depend on educational level. For elementary through high school level, our eligibility criteria consists of student attendance at a public or private school in the greater San Diego region. For undergraduate and graduate level our scholarship eligibility criteria consists of attendance at a college or university in the greater San Diego region.
- **4a.** Criteria we will use to select recipients for our educational grants will depend on educational level. For elementary through high school level, our scholarship criteria consists of academic performance, and excellence in the earth sciences category at a science fair. For undergraduate and graduate level our scholarship criteria consists of maintaining good academic standing, successful submittal of a scholarship application describing the student's research, and recommendation of faculty.
- **4b.** The number of grants made annually will be determined by the number of candidates meeting the eligibility and selection criteria, typically one each for elementary or middle school, high school, undergraduate, and graduate level.
- **4c.** The amount of each grant will be determined by the funds raised for scholarship purposes. The Society plans to make grants of the amount of funds collected for making grants. We expect to provide grants in the following approximate amounts: elementary and middle school \$50, high school \$100, undergraduate \$500, graduate \$750.
- **4d.** There is no specific requirement or condition imposed on grant recipients to obtain a grant. Once a recipient has received a scholarship at a particular educational level, that recipient becomes ineligible for a Society scholarship at that level. It is requested that a scholarship recipient present his or her research either as a poster display or by oral presentation to the Society.
  - 5. Educational scholarships will be provided to the student without conditions or supervision.
- **6.** The selection committee will be the board of directors at large until the directors form a scholarship selection committee by resolution of the board. Selection committee recommendations will be subject to conditions as directed by the Society board.
